This term we are going to be busy getting out and about! Our horse riding sessions begin on Tuesday. Not everyone will be able to ride – Larkrise Farm will assess each child and decide if they have the appropriate facilities to enable each child to ride safely. Each child MUST wear a riding helmet whilst on a horse. They won't be allowed to ride without one. Helmets are provided by the farm, but if you know your child loves to ride but isn't so keen to wear a riding hat, then it might be worth encouraging them to have a practise if you can!

If your child is not able to ride then they will take part in animal care sessions, looking at and looking after rabbits, guinea pigs, sheep, chickens and a couple of piggies – as well as the horses! Please send back the permission letter that allows us to take your child to the farm and to participate in the activities offered. If you don't return the slip then, unfortunately, your child will not be able to take part.

We will also need a pair of wellies (if appropriate) and a waterproof coat in school for your child on Tuesday to protect them from the Great British summer weather whilst we're down on the farm!

As well as getting down on the farm, we are also getting sporty! We have been invited to take part in a special colour run event in July, organised by Rachel Bown, our ex PE teacher. There will be lots of different activities and lots of paint – it sounds messy and colourful... and a lot of fun!

We're looking forward to a really exciting summer term.
